Jewish boys and men cover their heads with a *kippah* (skullcap) out of respect for God. Some cover their heads all the time, while others do so only when they pray or study the Torah. *Kippahs*, also known as *yarmulkes*, come in all shapes and sizes. Sometimes you can tell where somebody comes or what his favorite movie or sport is from his *kippah*.
